While we're not television fans, we occasionally watch YouTube and its travelogues. Recently, searching for some Cornish tourism sites, we came across a site called "Cornish Turdtowns – The places tourists don't see". It didn't sound like the Cornwall I last visited in 2006, so I watched the 16-minute program to see what I might learn.

There were 8 towns listed, with a little about each one. It also showed the crime rate and average home price compared with the averages in all of Cornwall.

Number 8 was Launceston, where there apparently is nothing to do other than drink.

Newquay was next. It mentioned the great beaches, touristy shops, and mediocre hotels, but the high crime rate was a negative. Our Rosevear Reunion was held in Newquay in 1990, and I thought it was a wonderful place.

Sixth on the list was Penzance, said to be poverty-stricken. It didn't seem so in 2006 when we spent some time there.

Number 5 was Redruth, said to be the least inspiring place, boring and dull.

Camborne was #4, due to its poverty, no doubt affected by the closing of the mines.

Third on the list was Liskeard, a run-down town with the highest crime rate in Cornwall, according to the narrator.

Taking second place was Bodmin. The slogan "Going Bodmin" is said to describe a crazy person.

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Topping the list at Number one as the worst town in Cornwall was St Austell, where the narrator "didn't feel entirely safe" and called it a "Desperate place". Heavy drug use, especially heroin, was mentioned. We stayed in St Austell in 2006, and I didn't get that impression in the least. My ancestors are from that area of Cornwall.

Having had 3 fantastic trips to Cornwall, it's hard to imagine that it's as bad as this program would have us believe. If you've been there recently, what's your take? Has it changed that much in the last 18 years since my last visit?
